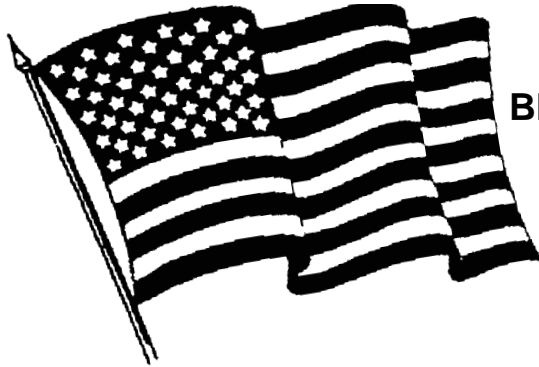

**Buy A Brick Campaign**

The Hanover Elks is conducting a "Buy a Brick Campaign" to beautify the outside of the Lodge. Have you noticed the new sign? Looks Great! Right?

The campaign will pay for the sign, and a 4 foot walkway made from pavers. The walkway will be replacing the current concrete walkway that goes to the flag pole and will extend around the sign base. The cost of the 4" x 8" paver will be \$100.00. You will be able to add 3 lines of print. 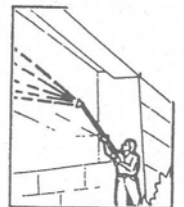
