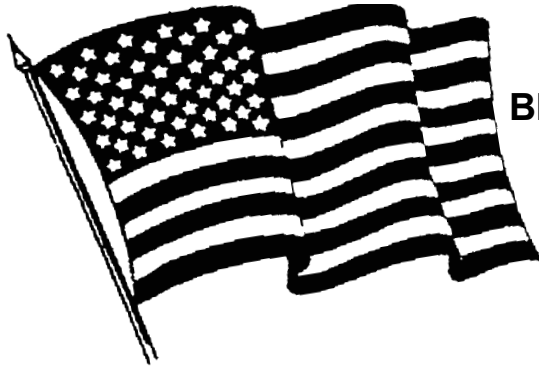

Buy A Brick Campaign

The Hanover Elks is conducting a "Buy a Brick Campaign" to beautify the outside of the Lodge. Have you noticed the new sign? Looks Great! Right?

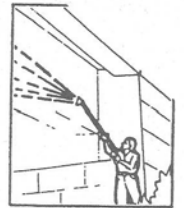

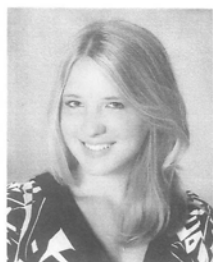
ELK OF THE MONTH
